The North Carolina Community Colleges Foundation has again approved scholarships for two W. Dallas Herring Fellowships to attend a Future Presidents Institute which Dr. Donny Hunter will conduct at The Center for School Leadership Development at the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill. The dates are September 2-5, 2008, with pre- and post-session readings and projects. The Institute will be open to 25 persons, two of whom will be Herring Fellows. I have attached information about the Institute. Also attached is the application form, which should be completed and sent to me if you wish to nominate a person on your staff for the Fellowship. If you have persons interested in the Institute whom you may not wish to nominate for the scholarship, they may apply directly to Dr. Hunter.

Here is what we are looking for in a scholarship recipient:

- 1. A person who is ready to be a president in the next one to three years.
- 2. A holder of a doctoral degree or a candidate for the doctorate who will complete requirements for the degree within the next two years.
- 3. A proven community college leader who has served as a Dean or Vice President.
- 4. A proven community leader as evidenced by record of community service.
- 5. An articulate and intelligent person who is committed to the philosophy of the community college movement as espoused by Dr. Dallas Herring.
- 6. A person who is committed to a career as President of a North Carolina community college. A recipient who accepts a presidency in another state within five years will be expected to repay in full the scholarship received.

Diversity in community college leadership is a priority in our System. Therefore, nominations of women and minority candidates are encouraged.

The deadline for receipt of nominations is Wednesday, April 2, 2008. If you have any questions, please call me.

Program Outline

The program will consist of three phases. Phase I will involve the participants in a directed readings and response exercise. Participants will receive a packet of readings each month for the three months leading up to the concluding seminar. These readings will be in-depth reviews of critical leadership and management concepts and important community college issues. The purpose of the directed readings and response exercises is to allow the participants to increase and broaden their knowledge and understanding of critical community college issues and become skilled in determining the underlying leadership and management concepts. Each month the participants will receive feedback and coaching regarding their responses to the assigned readings. Phase II of the program consist of a seminar. The seminar will be oriented towards the practical side of presidential leadership. The faculty will be individuals who have outstanding reputations as experienced leaders in community colleges or in equivalent leadership positions. Phase III will be follow-up directed readings and response exercises and a concluding one-day session.
