2008 EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING AWARD (EIT)

Background

The State Board of the NC Community College System established the "Excellence In Teaching" program in 1985. This program is designed to provide statewide recognition of teachers who exemplify the highest quality and standards throughout the NC Community College System.

The objective of this award is to identify and individually recognize North Carolina Community College System faculty who have consistently demonstrated excellence in teaching to their students and college.

The award winner will receive a cash prize of \$8,000 and a plaque. The winner's college foundation will receive a cash prize of \$2,000. All finalists will receive a cash award of \$500 and plaques. Plaques will also be given to the college of the winner and finalists. All college nominees will receive a certificate acknowledging their achievement after the *Day of Recognition* program.

Selection of Award Recipients

The screening and selection process will occur in four stages. First, the Excellence In Teaching (EIT) screening committee will conduct the initial screening of applications. Second, the EIT interview committee will interview the selected semi-finalists and recommend the finalists. Third, the EIT committee of the State Board of Community Colleges will interview the selected finalists and recommend the winner to the full State Board. Fourth, the winner, finalists, and their colleges will be publicly identified and recognized at the *Day of Recognition* program on November 21, 2008.

The EIT committee chair is the Vice President of Academic and Student Services. Committee members are system-wide representatives of various groups including the Faculty Association, Instructional Administrators Association, previous award winners, and System Office staff.

Eligibility

Any permanent full-time faculty member, other than past winners, is eligible to be considered for this nomination. Nominations are limited to one per institution.

Nomination Process

Each Community College President is requested to nominate one faculty member each year. Nominations for 2008 are due by *May 19, 2008*. The winner will be announced at the *2008 Day of Recognition* program on Friday, November 21, 2008. Colleges are encouraged to utilize a peer recommendation process on their campus to solicit nominations.

Five copies of the nominee's packet must be received by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, May 19, 2008 (no e-mails or faxes).

Application

Attached is a one-page nomination form that must be completed and returned with the nominee's narrative and vita.

Please develop a narrative, not to exceed <u>seven</u> pages. Each single page is to address <u>one</u> of the selection criteria in single space format as numbered below. Additional information of more than one page per criteria will not be considered.

Selection Criteria - Demonstration or examples of:

- 1. Interactions with students that focus on their successful development as whole persons.
- 2. Effective classroom environments that result in motivated students and successful learning.
- 3. Innovations in teaching methods including the effective use of technology.
- 4. Professional development activities and experiences that enhance teaching effectiveness.

Please do not submit pictures, videos, portfolios, etc. The narrative should demonstrate the nominee's commitment to excellence in teaching and reflect work directed to the selection criteria.

The only supplemental material reviewed will be student/peer evaluations and letters of support. Nomination materials will not be returned.
