**Subject:** Curriculum Standard Revision Approvals

Per 1D SBCCC 400.9 (b) A revision of an existing curriculum standard shall:

- (1) Have written concurrence by two-thirds of colleges approved to offer the curriculum program; and
- (2) Be in alignment with criteria outlined in 1D SBCCC 400.10(e).
- (3) The President of the North Carolina Community College System shall have the authority to approve or deny the revision of an existing curriculum standard.

#### **Revisions:**

- Added the following two courses to all of the above:
  - o COM 120 Introduction to Interpersonal Communication
  - o DRA 111 Theatre Appreciation
- Removed the following course from the visual arts curriculum standard, visual arts CCP pathway, and theater curriculum standards above:
  - o MAT 272 Calculus II

Rationale: The Transfer Advisory Committee (TAC) approved the UGETC (Universal General Education Transfer Component) status for COM 120 Introduction to Interpersonal Communication and DRA 111 Theatre Appreciation. A revision was made to add these two courses to the curriculum standard for the Associate in Fine Arts in Visual Arts (A10600), Associate in Fine Arts in Visual Arts CCP Pathway (P1062C), Associate in Fine Arts in Music (A10700), and Associate in Fine Arts in Theatre (A10800).

Additionally, a revision was made to the Associate in Fine Arts in Visual Arts (A10600) curriculum standard, Associate in Fine Arts in Visual Arts CCP Pathway (P1062C), and Associate in Fine Arts in Theater (A10800) curriculum standard to remove MAT 272 Calculus II. MAT 271 Calculus I is a pre-requisite course for MAT 272 which meets the 4-hour math requirement in the Associate in Fine Arts in Visual Arts (A10600) curriculum standard, the CCP Associate in Fine Arts in Visual Arts CCP Pathway (P1062C), and the Associate in Fine Arts in Theater (A10800) curriculum standard.

#### **Public Safety Administration (A55480)**

#### **Revision:**

 Added additional General Education course options to the General Education area of the Public Safety Administration curriculum standard.

**Rationale:** The additional courses will allow colleges to better meet their accreditation requirements and college programs of study to be designed to support specific local public safety agency hiring preferences.

## Associate in Fine Arts in Visual Arts (A10600) Curriculum Standard

The Associate in Fine Arts in Visual Arts degree shall be granted for a planned program of study consisting of a minimum of **60-61 semester hours** of college transfer courses. Within the degree program, the institution shall include opportunities for the achievement of competence in reading, writing, oral communication, fundamental mathematical skills, and basic computer use.
